The Journey

With a view to helping the Mute Millions of the South East Manbhum, at present Purulia, to have for themselves a scope of higher education, Manbhum Ananda Ashram Nityananda Trust (MANT), an NGO of considerable repute, took up a momentous resolution of doing away with the curse of inferiority complex in the children of the soil and to make them the fit counterparts of those in other better off parts of West Bengal.

The year 1965 marked the centennial of Ramananda Chatterjee. The Trust, in humble acknowledgement of the sincere services of Ramananda Babu, proposed to raise a Degree College and name it after his centenary. It started collecting and depositing funds. When no princely donation could be collected, the common man came to the rescue. They contributed their mites and thus built-up the figure which had so long been the proud privilege of the uncommon man.

Starting its journey in 1971, Ramananda Centenary College is a Govt. aided Undergraduate Degree College offering Arts and Science courses. The college's specific mission is to instill knowledge and awareness among the people of the region for effecting a positive change in their living pattern. The institution serves a duality of purposes; it focuses its attention on both its students and the neighbouring community. NAAC Accreditation Committee awarded grade 'B' to the college in the year 2017. In the past ten years student strength has gradually increased and so has accompanying strength of teaching and administrative staff.

The institution is affiliated to Sidho Kanho Birsha University and currently offers Honours degree in fourteen subjects and General/Program degree in three subjects. The College has switched to Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2017. In keeping with the spirit and mission of the college, and to fulfill the demands of a modern, technology enhanced educational structure, the college has proposed the creation of new classrooms equipped with teaching-learning aids to aid in participatory learning.

To fully utilize the potential of higher education in bringing about a marked change in the living pattern of the wide commonalty of the area and to bring them at par with the people and pupils of the better off places.

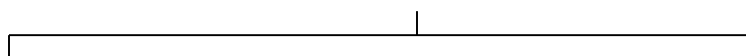

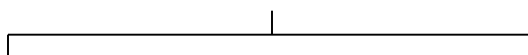

Infrastructure and Student Support Services

To satisfy the growing academic necessities the college, over the years, has developed the required infrastructural support system.

It has sufficient number of well furnished, spacious and airy class rooms. The laboratories, housed in a separate and exclusive block, are fully equipped and are regularly upgraded. The Central Library has 25,000 + books, in its racks. A no. of national and a few international journals on each subject are regularly being kept on the stands of the library. Internet facility has been extended to all the depts. of the college including the Library and the Teachers' Room. The Dept. of Chemistry has its own seminar library. A highly qualified, experienced and dedicated teaching faculty is the glory of the college. A fully furnished, air-conditioned 40-seated seminar hall to commemorate the birth centenary year of the founder of the college Late Harihar Mukherjee is under active consideration of establishment.

HOSTEL FACILITIES:

Two hostels - one for MEN (Tribal) and another for WOMEN - are there. The hostels are fully furnished and have the provision for running water. There are 40 seats in Men's Hostel as against 50 in Women's. Selection of boarders is made on the basis of distance of home from the College. A new Women's hostel for 50 boarders is being under construction with assistance from the U.G.C.

SPORTS AND GAMES:

The College has its own playfield. Adequate arrangement exists for the play of Football, Volleyball, Cricket, Table -Tennis, Carrom etc. A Multi-gym has been built up and is being run under the guidance of a qualified coach. Proposals have been pending with the UGC for the construction of a Stadium Gallery and an Indoor Sports Complex to facilitate active participation of the students in the sports and games component provided by the college.

CANTEEN:

The College has its own canteen dishing out hygienic refreshment, snacks etc. Prior intimation/order for lunch is required.

STUDENTS' COMMON ROOM:

There are two spacious Common Rooms - one for Boys and the other for Girls. These are furnished with indoor games articles, available on every working day and can be played there. Students are strictly forbidden to remove any college property from the Common Rooms. Students may relax in the Common Rooms during leisure.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

The College has 6 numbers of N. S. S. Units, out of which one Unit is exclusively for the girls, each having a student strength of 100 to facilitate Institutional Social Responsibility of the college. It has an N. C. C. unit, with 160 cadet strength, with a brilliant track record. 30 seats are reserved for girls in the N. C. C. unit.

CAREER COUNSELLING CELL:

The Career Counselling Cell works to guide the students in finding a choice career for him/her by supplying various notifications, literature, brochures and counsels by experts.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL:

Students may drop their grievance in a box posted for it. Prompt actions and remedial measures are appropriately taken.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

Merit based and Need based fee concession are allowed to 15% of the students. SC/ST students get Post-Matric stipend and scholarship. With assistance from UGC travelling assistance is paid to the needy students belonging to the BPL category. The college has introduced several awards for toppers in various categories of activities. Teachers' Council Offers 3 awards for the 3 best performers in the college annuals. Rashbehari Medal is being awarded by MANT, the founder NGO, to the student securing highest marks from among the students offering Hons. The coming days will see many more such prizes to eke out a spirit of healthy competition among the students. Sachindra Memorial Awards are being awarded for the best performance in Bio Science and for best leadership activities in NSS.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Admission:

(a) Admission to the College is entirely on merit and is conducted online as directed by the Govt. of West Bengal.

All admissions are provisional and subject to final scrutiny. The Academic Session covers the period, from 1st July to 30th June each year.

(b) Number of Seats :

The number of seats for each Honours subject and for the general courses is given below :

English (63) Bengali (81) Education (45) History (55) Geography (35) Pol. Science (33) Economics (33) Philosophy (33) Santali (33) Kudmali (30) Physics (14) Chemistry (30) BA Program (600, including Physical Education (P) 150) BSC Program (50)

(c) Reservation of seats:

22% for S. C. , 6% for S. T. , 10% for OBC-A & 7% for OBC-B

3% for Physically Handicapped from each categories

N.B. : Students seeking admission under reservation quota are to obtain the minimum eligibility marks for consideration.

2. Payment of Fees, Fines etc. :

(a) Monthly fees are to be cleared during the month, failing which the names of students shall be removed from the Rolls. Defaulters will have to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- per month.

(b) Readmission fees for the next higher class must be paid by the students within the prescribed date to be notified.

(c) All the students shall have to clear the dues before their respective Selection Tests.

(d) Students, as applicable, are to pay the following fines:

(i) Late return of Library Books Rs. 5/- for the 1st week and Rs. 10/- for each subsequent week or part thereof.

(ii) For duplicate Identity Card Rs. 15/-

3. Refund of Deposits:

Caution money deposits of whatever sort will be refunded after making deductions for general and specific damages as found necessary. A failure to collect the refund amount within the time specified by the college, will lead to its forfeiture.

4. Attendance Requirements:

Students must attend a minimum of 75% of the classes held. Students attending 60% to 74% of the classes become Non – collegiate and students attending less than 60% of the total classes become Dis-collegiate.

5. College Examination, Promotions etc. :

(a) Students are to appear in all College examinations. Hons. Students are to appear in all periodic Examinations and Class Tests and Trimester Examinations (Science only) as well. Selection for the University Examinations well entirely depend on the performance in the college examinations.

(b) Students failing to appear in a College examination must submit satisfactory explanation for his/her absence subject to verification by the college before that specific examination is over. Alongside they are to pay the following fines :

Rs. 40/- for each paper, Rs. 100/- for total absence (this rules is applicable for the students of general course only)

(c) Students absenting themselves in periodical/ trimester examinations as well as Test Examinations, for whatever reasons, will be denied the permission for taking the University Examinations.

6. Transfers (to and from the College)

(a) Students seeking transfer from the College will have to pay all charges and dues for the session in full in addition to a Transfer fee of Rs. 100/-. The guardian is to sign the application for transfer.

(b) Candidates seeking transfer to the College are to obtain prior permission from the Principal and submit the documents as desired by him/her.

7. Library :

The Library is the pride of the College. It has been fully computerized. It has a rich stock of books – text & reference. A no. of important national and international journals / magazines is available in the Reading Room annexed to it. It has also a Book – Bank facility for the poor but meritorious students. This helps students access to some latest treasures in their various fields of study. A Xerox machine has been installed in the library to enable the students to get photo copies of material on payment of a nominal fee of Rs. 0.50 per page. The library also has University questions for the last few years along with a set of model answers [the best possible answers compiled by the University of Burdwan] for consultation. Of late internet facility has been extended to the library in the Reading Room annexed to the Library.

8. Identity Card :

Students are issued Identity Cards after the Completion of the admission process. This card is to be carried by the students while in the campus and to be produced for obtaining a Certificate, Library

card etc. and also on demand by the authority or an authorized body or person.

9. College Discipline :

Some musts for students within the premises of the college :

- (i) Without the previous permission in writing of the Principal
 - (a) No meeting of students shall be called / held .
 - (b) No public function to which any outsider is invited shall be organized, and
 - (c) No outsider shall be allowed to address the students
- (ii) No theatrical performance, dance or show of any kind shall be held either within or outside the precincts of the college in its name except with the previous permission in writing of the Principal and on such terms and conditions as he may impose.
- (iii) No student shall:
 - (a) By words spoken or written or by signs of visible representation offend or insult a fellow student or any teacher of the college or any employee of office or authority of the college.
 - (b) Misappropriate, destroy, mutilate, disfigure or otherwise damage any property of the college including furniture, books, equipment, apparatus, or
 - (c) Disobey any rule or order for the time being in force in the College or in the University.
- (iv) Students are forbidden to indulge in any unseemly activities within the college compound .
- (v) Students in their free time are advised to go to the Students' Common Room or to the Library. Silence is to be observed within the college during class hours,i.e. 10-30 A.M. – 5-00P.M.
- (vi) Students who are absent from their classes for more than 7 days in a month must submit letters from their guardians supported by relevant documents, if necessary, as soon as they rejoin their classes.
- (viii) For a breach of discipline, committed by a student, the Principal of the college may :
 - (a) Warn him or her
 - (b) Impose a fine on him / her
 - (c) Suspend him / her from the college for a month or any short period.
 - (d) Expel him / her from the college for such period as he thinks fit.

N. B.: Most of the rules mentioned above are framed by the University.

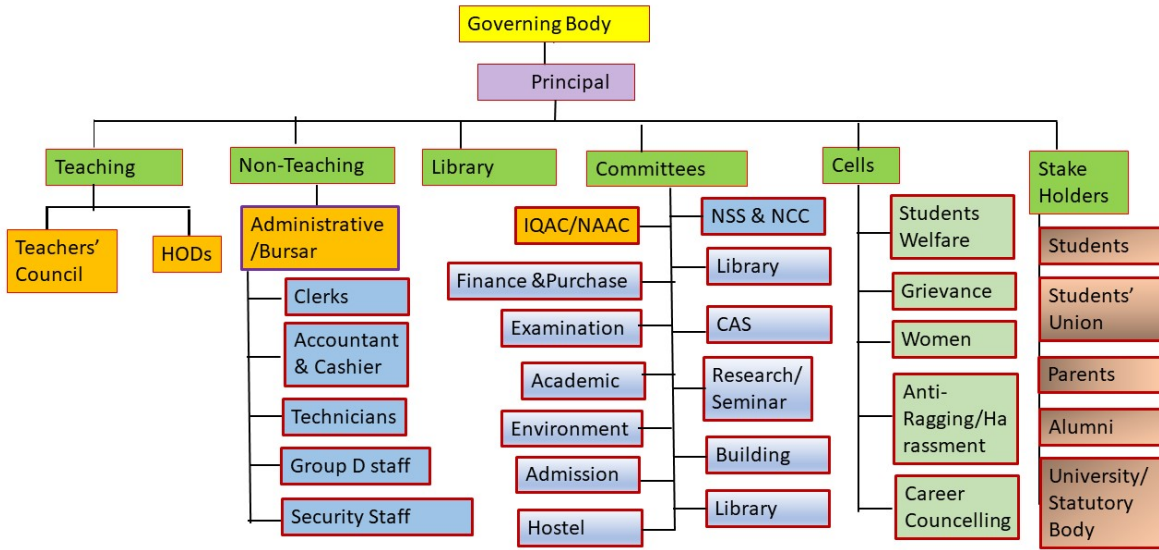
